(1) Ranger Safety: Course description;

This course will help leaders understand key safety issues that may arise during meetings, activities, and transportation. It will cover topics like proper approach to safety, principles of safety, personal and group responsibilities, assessing risk, and the importance of screening leaders. It is a required course for the Safety Level of the Outpost Leader Advancement Levels.

(2) Ranger Basics: Course description;

This is a one-day hands-on experience that teaches how to run successful outpost meetings, how to use the Rangers curriculum and advancement system, and how to build healthy relationships with boys and young men. You also learn soul-winning techniques for evangelism. It is a required course for the Ready Level of the Outpost Leader Advancement Levels.

(3) Church Security / How to Start Your Team: Course description;

In light of the current and ongoing instability and lawlessness in our country and around the world, and the growing distain toward Christian organizations and their gatherings, there is a real need for churches to get serious about protecting their church family, their pastors and their church property.

The task of putting together a safety/security team can seem overwhelming, and depending on your circumstances, it can be a huge task.

Where do I start? Who do I talk to? What equipment do we need?

It is more Than Just Showing Up and Looking Good, You NEED a plan of action.

It may be used for one of two required CLE courses for the Advance Level of the Outpost Leader Advancement Levels.

(4) First Aid / CPR & AED: Course description;

This is a Red Cross course and includes demonstration and evaluation of the skills learned in a practical exercise in front of a live instructor. It is a required course for the Safety Level of the Outpost Leader Advancement Levels.

The Importance of Training;

Most men can walk into a room of boys and be somewhat effective in teaching them, for a period of time. Soon you will run out of ideas, become frustrated and want to quit. How can you be effective teaching boys? You need to be trained. It has been said that "Knowledge is Power", and that is so true with boys.

Royal Rangers is a mentoring ministry for future men. You as a leader need to be well equipped to guide them on their journey to maturity in both life skills and in faith. A boy's regular interaction with godly men builds confidence and answers a boy's deepest question: "Do I have what it takes to be a man?" The young man arrives at the answer over a period of time as he regularly tests and compares his developing strength against that of other men. You are his "benchmark." Are you equipped to lead him into a godly manhood?

Take advantage of Royal Ranger training so that you can be effective to "Reach, Teach and Keep boys for Christ."

"OUTPOST LEADERSHIP AWARDS"

All leaders, adult, junior and pastors should be honored with these awards.

Orders must be placed to the District Commander by March 21st.

Medals will be awarded at the Dist. All Cmdrs. Conference in April or mailed.

"Special Service Award"...is awarded to any Rangers or Non-Rangers who have demonstrated a significant contribution and service to the Royal Rangers Ministry.

"Junior Leaders Service Award"...is a special award for junior commanders, senior guides and patrol guides who have demonstrated outstanding service in achieving the goals of the overall Royal Rangers Program.

"Leaders Service Award"...is a special achievement award for outpost leaders other than senior or outpost commanders – such as lieutenant commanders, chaplains, and outpost councilmen.

"Outpost Commanders Award"...is a special achievement award for outpost commanders who have demonstrated outstanding service in achieving the goals of the overall Royal Rangers Ministry.

"Senior Commanders Award"...is a special achievement award for senior commanders who have demonstrated outstanding service in achieving the goals of the overall Royal Rangers Ministry.

"Pastors Award"...is for Pastors in recognition for their support of the Royal Rangers Ministry.

"<u>District Leadership Award</u>"...is a special achievement award for section, division, & district leaders, who wear the blue, or gold oak leaf & who have demonstrated outstanding service in achieving the goals of the overall Royal Rangers Ministry.

"<u>District Executive Leadership Award</u>"...is a special achievement award for district leaders who wear the silver oak leaf & who have demonstrated outstanding service in achieving the goals of the overall Royal Rangers Ministry.

First Year Award:

\$31.50 includes Class "A" Drape Medal & Blass "B" Ribbon & Certificate.

Second Year & After:

\$10.50 includes Service Numbers for Class "A" Medal & Class "B" Ribbon.

Blue or Silver Cluster Award: Second Year & After Service Numbers only for Class "A" Medal \$5.25
